K-5th Grade

- Cobb Hebrew School for K-5th will take place on **Sunday Morning 10:00-11:30 am** in person at Chabad of Cobb and includes Aleph Champ lessons.
- There will be classes on these dates below. Please mark your calendars!
January 10, 17, 24, 31
February 7, 28
March 7, 14, 21
April 18, 25
May 2, 9
- There will be no more than 10 students with 1 teacher per group.
- Students will not be mixing with other groups at any time during the day.
- Masks will be mandatory for both teachers and students. If a student is unable to keep their mask on throughout the day, they will be asked to switch to virtual Hebrew lessons.
- Temperature will be taken at drop off before child enters the building. Any child with a temperature of 99.5 or higher will be sent home.
- The classroom door to outside will remain open throughout the day to help with circulation. Please dress warmly on cold days.
- There will be NO adults allowed in the building at any time during Hebrew School other than our teachers. All parents can email/text/call with any questions or concerns as necessary.
- There will be hand sanitizing stations around the building that will be used throughout the day, including the beginning of the day as students enter the building.
- Our onsite custodian will be sanitizing the building thoroughly throughout the day, including door handles, bathrooms etc...

Sick Policy:

- Please check your child's temperature at home prior to coming to Hebrew School if they may be ill.
- Keep your child home if they are showing any signs or symptoms of illness.
- Children must be symptom free (without the aid of a fever reducing medication) for 72 hours.
- If your child has an excessive and unusual runny nose, cough or sneeze, fever, vomiting, diarrhea, rash, loss of taste or smell, or any other symptoms typical of COVID-19, the student will be separated from the group until they can be picked up by a parent or guardian.
- If you, your spouse or other members of your family have a temperature or are sick, we respectfully request that you keep your child/ren home.
- The success of in person Hebrew School depends upon all families openly and honestly communicating whether anyone in their home has tested positive or even has any related symptoms.

6th-8th Grade

- Cobb Hebrew School classes for 6th-8th grade middle school students will take place Sunday Mornings 10:30-11:15 am virtually via Zoom.
- 10:30-10:45 Morning Tefillah (Prayers)
10:45-11:15 Each week will be a different Jewish subject and the students should come prepared with questions relating to the topic of the week.

2nd - 7th Virtual Hebrew Aleph Champ Lessons

- Virtual Hebrew reading Aleph Champ lessons will be one-on-one with an exceptional Hebrew reading teacher who will keep your child progressing in Hebrew reading.
